BJP retains Arunachal for the third time in a row

Itanagar: The BJP on Sunday returned to power in Arunachal Pradesh for the third time in a row. winning 46 seats in the 60-member Assembly, and bagging four more seats compared to its 2019 tally. In sweeping the Assembly elections, the counting of which was held during the day, the BJP decimated the opposition parties, especially the Congress which was relegated to the fifth position with only one seat after NPP (5), NCP

(3) and PPA (2). Three seats went to Independent candidates. Chief Minister Pema Khandu asserted that the momentum of what happened in the 'Land of the rising sun', a sobriquet for Arunachal Pradesh, will spread to other parts of the country on June 4 when votes for the Lok Sabha elections will be counted. "This is a historic occasion for the BJP and entire Arunachal Pradesh. The people of Arunachal Pradesh have declared

that they want BJP to stav in power for the next five vears. This time, the mandate is more than what we got in 2019. In the 2019 Assembly polls, BJP won 41 seats, while we have won 46 seats this time," Khandu told PTI Video. Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated the people of Arunachal Pradesh for the landslide win. "Thank you Arunachal Pradesh! The people of this wonderful state have ...

Modi eyes record-equalling feat, Oppn hopes for rebound

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi eves record-equalling third straight term in power amid the INDIA opposition bloc's hope of springing a surprise as the counting of votes for the Lok Sabha election is set for Tuesday, bringing an end to a marathon polling exercise stretching over 80 days. While most experts have long seen the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) as the favourite in the polls, a lot is at stake for the ruling combine in terms of the scale of victory it can pull off and new territories it can conquer. The opposition's stakes are higher still amid its reducing national footprint. Exit polls have been, however, unanimous in their prediction that the NDA is closer to realising Modi's ambitious target of "400 paar" for his alliance than the INDIA bloc is to ...

Mumbai Airport declares emergency after bomb threat

Mumbai: A full emergency was declared at Mumbai airport on Sunday after a Vistara flight from Paris received a bomb threat. This marks the second threat against a Vistara flight in the past two days. On Fridav. a Delhi-Srinagar flight was also threatened. The airline reported that flight UK 024 from Paris' Charles de Gaulle Airport to Mumbai received a handwritten note on an airsickness bag, threatening a bomb. Despite the threat, the flight landed safely at 10:19 am, after which security agencies began a thorough check. "A security concern was noted by our staff onboard flight UK 024 from Paris to Mumbai on June 2, 2024," Vistara stated. A spokesperson for the airline mentioned that following protocol, Vistara immediately informed the relevant authorities. The flight landed at Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport, Mumbai, and the airline is fully cooperating with security agencies for all mandatory checks. On Friday, operations at Srinagar airport were disrupted for an hour after a Vistara flight from Delhi received a bomb threat. The aircraft was searched by bomb...

Stage set for counting of votes in Assam today

Guwahatil: Assam will count votes for 14 Lok Sabha constituencies in 52 centers across 50 state election districts on Tuesday. The counting process is expected to be completed in 10 to 28 rounds, with some constituencies requiring a maximum of 28 rounds. A total of 5,823 vote-counting officers have been appointed, supported by 64 general observers. The final results will be declared from multiple locations, including Dhubri, Kokrajhar, Barpeta, Guwahati, Udalguri, Nagaon, Diphu, Jorhat, Dibrugarh, Lakhimpur, Sonitpur, Karimganj, and Golaghat, between 4 and 4:30 pm...

SKM sweeps Assembly polls in Sikkim, wins 31 of 32 seats



Gangtok: The Sikkim Krantikari Morcha (SKM) on Sunday returned to power in the Himalayan state for the second consecutive term by a landslide victory, winning 31 seats in the 32-member Assembly. The opposition Sikkim Democratic Front (SDF), which ruled the state for 25 years in a row till 2019, could manage only one seat, though its president Pawan Kumar Chamling lost in the two constituencies he contested. SKM president and Chief Minister Prem Singh Tamang, however, won from two seats, and the party bagged 58.38 per cent of the votes polled. The SKM had won 17 seats in the 2019 Assembly polls. Elections to the Assembly were held simultaneously with the first phase of the Lok Sabha polls on April 19. Prime Minister Narendra Modi hailed Tamang and the SKM for the victory. "Congratulations to SKM and CM @PSTamangGolay for their victory in the Sikkim Assembly Elections 2024. I look forward to working with the State Government to further the progress of Sikkim in the coming times," Modi said in a post on X. Responding to the Prime Minister's post, Tamang thanked him. "We are committed to continuing our efforts towards the development and prosperity of Sikkim. We look forward to collaborating with vou to achieve our shared goals for the betterment of our state. "Your unwavering support has been a driving force for us, and we look forward to your continued guidance and blessings," Tamang said in an X. Modi also thanked all who voted for the BJP in the Sikkim Assembly elections. The saffron partv contested in 31 seats but failed to win any of them. The party bagged 5.18 per cent of the total votes polled. Sikkim BJP president Dilli Ram Thapa, a sitting MLA, also lost to SKM nominee Kala Rai in the Upper Burtuk...

BJP returns to power in Arunachal for the 3rd time in a row

Given an unequivocal mandate to politics of development. My gratitude to them for reposing their faith in @ BJP4Arunachalyet again. Our Party will keep working with even greater vigour for the state's growth." Modi said in a post on X. In response. Khandu said, "Your guidance and vision have played a monumental role in our success. We shall continue with greater vigour to work for Sabka Sath. Sabka Vikas." Khandu himself won uncontested from the Mukto Assembly constituency. Nine other BJP candidates also tasted victory unopposed. "The people of the state has repaid to the contribution of Prime Minister (Narendra Modi).....The development witnessed under the BJP-led NDA regime in the state is the major factor for the party's win in the state." Khandu asserted. The development witnessed in Arunachal Pradesh under the BJP-led central government is a major factor for the party's win in the state, the chief minister asserted. "The BJP has started its winning streak from the 'Land of Rising Sun' (Arunachal) and this trend will spread throughout the country which the people will witness on June 4. The party will sweep the Lok Sabha polls with a huge margin and Narendra Modi become the Prime Minister for the third term," he told reporters. To a question regarding the formation of the new ministry, Khandu said that after the Lok Sabha polls counting on June 4, all the winning candidates of the party would convene a meeting where the chief ministerial candidate would be decided. "BJP is a disciplined party. The party will select the leader with consensus from all elected candidates." Khandu said. While the BJP's vote share is 54 57 per cent as many as 14 party candidates including Education Minister Taba Tedir, were defeated this time. The minister was defeated by NCP nominee Toko Tatung, a greenhorn, in the Yachuli constituency. A total of 20 first-timers tasted victory in the northeastern state. Eleven of them are from BJP. four from NPP, two each from PPA and NCP and one independent. The opposition Congress which fielded 19 candidates in the 60-member Assembly managed to bag only one seat, Bamang, where former state home minister Kumar Waii won by a slender margin of 635 votes defeating BJP's Doba Lamnio. State Congress president NabamTuki said the party was "disappointed but not demoralised" by the election results. "We will introspect about the causes of the defeat and work on the organisation in the coming days," he added. The National People's Party (NPP) which won five seats. annexed 16.11 per cent while the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) gained a vote share of 10.43 per cent and won three seats. The regional People's Party of Arunachal (PPA) which managed to win two seats had a vote share of 7.24 per cent. Kiren Rijjiju, Union minister and Lok Sabha poll candidate from Arunachal Pradesh, said the credit for this Assembly polls results goes to the people of the state, the BJP workers and the leadership of PM Modi. "The development that took place in Arunachal Pradesh in the last 10 years, didn't happen when the Congress was in power there for 60 years ... This victory will inspire us to work more in the future," Rijiju said.

The BJP has been accused of using electronic voting machines to send a message to the bureaucracy, while the Congress has been reduced to a pale shadow in several states. The outcome will determine whether the Congress has the organization and leadership to challenge the BJP, which has been reducing its footprint since 2014. The Left's future is also uncertain, with the BJP aiming to gain strength in eastern states.

In the 2019 LokSabha election in Karimganj seat. Mallah had emerged victorious by getting 4,73,046 votes. AIUDF's RadheshyamBiswas, who had received the second maximum votes, got 4.34.657 votes. The counting in Karimganj will be held at Karimgani College. Postal ballots of two districts - Karimganj and Hailakandi (which fall under the KarimganjLokSabha constituency) will be counted at first. Followed by that, the votes of four assembly constituencies will be counted. The votes of North Karimganj assembly constituency (total number of polling booths - 301) will be counted in 14 tables and in 22 rounds. The votes of South Karimgani assembly constituency (312 polling centres) will be counted in 14 tables and in 23 rounds. The votes of Patharkandi assembly constituency (198 polling stations) will be counted in 12 tables and in 17 rounds while that of Ramakrishnanagar constituency (247 polling booths) will be counted in 14 tables and in 18 rounds.

Numbers the exit polls have thrown in NDA's favour is one of the reasons for that belief. Meanwhile, Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh hit out at Prime Minister Modi for holding several meetings, including a long brainstorming session to review the 100- day agenda of the "new government", saying these were "pressure tactics" to send out a signal to the bureaucracy and the administrative structure that he is coming back. "These are mind games -- 'I am coming back, I am going to be the prime minister again'. He is sending a signal to the bureaucracy, the administrative structure of the country and we hope that the civil servants who have been entrusted with the responsibility of ensuing a fair counting of votes will not be intimidated and not be frightened by these pressure tactics," Ramesh told media at the AICC headquarters here. He also said that the exit polls that came out Saturday evening are "completely bogus" and have been "orchestrated and masterminded by the man whose exit is inevitable and guaranteed on June 4". "These are all part of the psychological games being played by the outgoing prime minister (Narendra Modi) and the outgoing home minister (Amit Shah). The outgoing home minister called up 150 District Magistrates and collectors yesterday. The results that the exit polls have come up with bear no relation to reality," the Congress leader claimed. "It flies in the face of all political feedback. The IN-

DIA 'janbandhan' parties met yesterday, we went through state-wise analysis and there is no way INDIA janbandhan is going to get less than 295 seats," Ramesh said. "This is a deliberate attempt to justify rigging, this is a deliberate attempt to justify manipulation of EVMs and this is also psychological ops to lower the morale of the Congress workers and the INDIA janbandhan workers. We are not going to be frightened, we are not going to be intimidated and you will see that the actual results on June 4 will be completely different from what these exit polls show," the Congress general secretary said. These are political exit polls and not professional exit polls, he added. Ramesh pointed out that Congress treasurer and senior leader Ajay Maken has raised the issue of candidates' counting agents at the Assistant Returning Officer (ARO) table not being allowed. "He (Maken) has raised this issue, there has been some response from the CEO of Delhi but the fact of the matter is that he raised this issue based on legitimate fears that had been expressed by the candidates. We have raised the issue of the counting of postal ballots and the effort of the Election Commission to change the methodology that has been part of the law," Ramesh said. He said the Congress has raised all such issues before the poll watchdog and had filed 117 complaints to it over the lass 77 days, 14 of which are against the PM.

Amit & Jaismine bag Paris Olympic tickets

New Delhi: 2022 Commonwealth Games gold medallist Amit Panghal (51kg) and Jaismine Lamboria (women's 57 kg) clinched India's fifth and sixth Paris Olympic quotas respectively by winning their quarterfinal bouts in the Boxing World Qualifiers in Bangkok, Thailand, on Sunday. Panghal relied on his quick-fire movement and combination of jabs and uppercuts to overcome a slow start and earn a unanimous 5:0 verdict against China's Liu Chuang in the 51kg quarterfinals while Jaismine, who got a chance to participate in the 57kg category as Boxing Federation of India had to surrender the quota won by Parveen Hooda, defeated Mali's Marine Camara by an identical score line. India had sent a 10-member contingent to Bankok which included seven men and three women boxers. Nishant Dev became the first Indian male boxer to earn qualification in 71kg category when he defeated Moldova's Vasile Cebotari in the quarterfinals on Friday. India had earlier earned three quotas at the 2022 Asian Games through Nikhat Zareen (women's 50kg), Preeti (54kg) and Tokyo Olympics bronze medallist Lovlina Borgohain (75kg) by virtue of all of them finishing on the podium in Guangzhou, Chi-



na.Panghal added to that list on Sunday with a fine display of tenacity and aggression against Chuang, who had drawn first blood by claiming Round 1 4:1 on the back some fine punches. But the Indian national champion came out all guns blazing in Round 2 and attacked relentlessly to grab the advantage, impressing all the five judges. The deciding round was a frantic display of boxing by both pugilists as they attempted to outpunch each other. Panghal ultimately came out on top as he smartly manoeuvred his Chinese opponent and landed his combination on his face and body to clinch the bout with a unanimous verdict. In the evening session, Jaismine justified the selectors decision to field her in 57kg instead of her regular 60kg weight category, where she was a reserve for this event, by dominating all the three rounds against Camara. However, it was disappointing end for Sachin Siwach in the final bout for the Indian contingent as he went down 0:5 against Kyrgyzstan's Munarbek Seiitbek Uul in the third place play-off of the men's 57kg category

Esha Singh in final and Ramita Jindal finishes sixth in Munich

New Delhi: Esha Singh reached the final of the Women's 25M Pistol, even as Ramita Jindal finished sixth in the Women's 10M Air Rifle on competition Day Two of the ongoing International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) World Cup Rifle/Pistol in Munich on Monday. The day, however, belonged to China as it won the first two gold medals on offer, with Sheng Lihao setting a new world record in the Men's Air Rifle final. Sheng's effort of 254.5 erased Indian Divyansh Singh Panwar's mark of 253.7, set in Cairo earlier this year. Esha's two-day qualification total of 584, gave her the sixth qualifying spot for Tuesday's

final. She shot 291 in the second rapid-fire round on Monday. Meanwhile, Ramita shot 166.3 to bow out sixth in the Women's Air Rifle final. In a battle of teenagers, 17-yearold World Championship silver medallist Huang Yuting (252.7) of China won the title over 16-yearold Korean Ban Hyojin (252.7) off the last shot by the slimmest of margins. India is being represented by a 23-member Rifle and Pistol squad for the ISSF World Cup in Munich. The top three shooters recently seen in action during the first-ever Olympic Selection Trials, mostly make up the squad. India are participating in all 10 Olympic events
