RSS meet to discuss attack on Hindus in Bangladesh



New Delhi: The recent attack on Hindus in Bangladesh will be one of the key topics of discussion during three-day Akhil Bharatiya Samanvay Baithak of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh(RSS), scheduled to be held in Palakkad from Saturday. RSS national spokesperson Sunil Ambekar said in Palakkad on Friday that the attack on Hindus and various other issues raised by the leaders of 32 RSS inspired organisations would be discussed in the meeting. Sarsanghachalak Mohan Bhagwat, general secretary Dattatreya Hosabale, and six joint general secretaries Krishna Gopal, C.R. Mukund, Arun Kumar, Ram Dutt Chakradar, Atul Limaye, and Alok Kumar will be among the top leadership attending the Baithak. The centenary celebrations of the RSS will begin on Vijayadashami day of 2025 and will continue until the Vijayadashami. The farmers have also called for strict action against Kangana

Vinesh Phogat joins farmers' protest at Sambhu border

New Delhi: Olympian Vinesh Phogat attended an event of farmers at the Shambhu border as their protest, demanding a legal guarantee for the Minimum Support Price (MSP), entered its 200th day on Saturday, August 31. Protests are also scheduled to occur at the Khanauri, Shambhu, and Ratanpura borders. Farmers, who are asking for a legal guarantee for the MSP for all crops, along with other critical issues, have been protesting at the Shambhu border since February 13, after their march to Delhi was blocked by authorities. Vinesh Phogat, a well-known athlete and supporter of the farmers' movement, was honored by the farmers during the day's events. It has been a topsy-turvy month for Vinesh after she reached the final of the women's 50kg event but still returned to India empty-handed. On August 7, Sarah Ann Hildebrandt of the United States stood between Vinesh and the gold medal.

However, things went downhill after she was disqualified before the final after breaching the 50kg



weight limit. A day after her heartbreaking disqualification. Vinesh announced her decision to retire from wrestling. She also made a plea to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) to award her a joint silver medal. The CAS deferred the verdict a couple of times and eventually dismissed the application filed by Vinesh for a silver medal in the women's 50kg event at the Paris Olympics. Amritsar district farmer leader Baldev Singh Bagga claimed that efforts to communicate with the government have gone unanswered, The Times of India reported.

"Farmer organisations had repeatedly written to

Prime Minister Narendra Modi as well as former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh but have received no responses. As Modi enters his 11th year in office, rather than addressing our demands, the government continues to suppress the voice of farmers," Tol quoted Baldev Singh Bagga as saving.

Convenor of the Kisan Mazdoor Morcha Sarvan Singh Pandher appealed to the farmers to gather in significant numbers at the Shambu and Khanauri points on August 31, it added. "We will once again present our demands to the government, and new announcements will be made.

India's ties with US form a 'very invaluable relationship': Jaishankar

New Delhi: India's ties with the US constitute a very invaluable relationship", external affairs minister S Jaishankar said on Friday, while simultaneously asserting that New Delhi should "not be intimidated" from pursuing its economic relations with Russia. Jaishankar spoke extensively on India's foreign policy and relations with countries in the neighbourhood and with key global powers such as China, Russia and the US at an event to mark the release of the book "Strategic Conundrums: Reshaping India's foreign policy" by former ambassador Rajiv Sikri. He said, just as the book acknowledges, the relationship with the US is for strategic and economic purposes a "very invaluable relationship for us". He added, "Therefore, I would actually argue that the US is today indispensable for our multipolarity to go up, that if we need that decision-making space, that freedom, we need countries whose interest it is that we have those margins on our side."

Jaishankar said no one is in denial about the history of the India-US relationship, which faced a series of challenges from the 1950s to the 1980s. "The challenge for us is when we think of multipolarity and strategic autonomy; because of that history, it is often a concept where we posit ourselves against the US," he said. "The reality of the world today is something very different. If we look at where the pressures are, the primary source of pressure is no longer the US.

In a way, because the world has changed, our understanding of the US has changed...The US understanding of us has too." Jaishankar also pointed to convergences in India-US relations. "India and the US, by their nature, will always have interests that will differ and diverge from those of the other part," he said. When it comes to Russia, India will have to be sensitive to a "Eurasian balance", he said. "It's a core strategic requirement for us. But I would also say if you look at trade with Russia, which has gone up five times, and it's not just a simple oil issue, I would urge you to look at it much more deeply, that there is an economic complementarity between India and Russia," he said, referring to India's decision to ramp up purchases of discounted Russian crude since 2022.

BJP ally JD(U) promises release of stone pelters

New Delhi: Janata Dal (United), a key ally of the Bharatiya Janata Party-led NDA at the Centre, has promised the release of stone pelters and political prisoners in its manifesto for the upcoming assembly election in Jammu and Kashmir.

The state unit of the party also claims to have written to Union home ministry to go through the cases of the stone pelters and release them from iails. PM Narendra Modi flags off 3 new Vande Bharat Express

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi flagged off three new Vande Bharat Express trains on Saturday August 31 through video conferencing, to enhance connectivity in Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, and Karnataka, the railway ministry said. The three trains add to the network of more than 100 Vande Bharat Express trains that are operational, connecting more than 280 districts. Prime Minister Modi inaugurated three Vande Bharat Express trains — one from Chennai Central to Nagercoil, second from Madurai to Bengaluru Cantonment and third from Meerut City-Lucknow — via video



conferencing. The ministry said since its debut, the Vande Bharat Express has become a symbol of India's aspirations in comfort meets speed, luxurious rail travel. This indigenously developed train was first introduced on February 15, 2019, under the 'Make in

India' initiative. Today, more than 100 Vande Bharat Express train services are operational across the country, extending connectivity to over 280 districts and transforming the travel experience for millions, it added. Realising Prime Minister's vision of 'Make

Assam TMC president Ripun Bora quits party

Guwahati: Assam Trinamool Congress president Ripun Bora on Sunday resigned from the party, claiming that the people of the northeastern state consider it as a "regional party" of West Bengal and are "not willing to accept" it as their own.

In a letter to All India Trinamool Congress general secretary Abhishek Baneriee, the former Rajya Sabha member said he had offered many suggestions to party supremo and West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Baneriee to make TMC acceptable in Assam. but those were "not implemented". "Assam TMC has great potential, but several recurring issues have hindered our progress, including the perception of TMC as a regional party of West Bengal. To counter this perception, we made several suggestions," Bora said in his resignation letter.

Bora claimed that he had suggested the need for an Assamese leader at the national level of TMC, declaring the residence of Bharat Ratna Dr Bhupen Hazarika at Tollygunge in Kolkata as a heritage site and converting the Madhupur Satra at Cooch Behar into a cultural hub.

One arrested, another at large in Shillong rape case

Shillong: A 19-year-old man was arrested on Saturday for his alleged involvement in the rape of a girl in Malki, Shillong, according to police reports. Authorities are also conducting a manhunt for a second suspect, who remains at large. The arrest followed an FIR lodged at the Laitumkhrah police station, naming the two accused in the assault. During the investigation, police arrested Andy Malngiang, who has since been placed in 14-day judicial custody. He has been charged under Sections 351(3) and 70(1) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) of 2023.

Manipur's Meitei, Kuki-Zo Groups Call For Centre's Attention As Parliament Session Begins

Kuki organisations rally across hill districts, demand separate Kukiland for peace

The first Lok Sabha session of Modi 3.0 today coincided with massive peaceful protests across Manipur by both the valley-dominant Meitei community and the hill-dominant Kuki-Zo tribes, who have been fighting since May 2023. The general category Meiteis want to be included under the Scheduled Tribes (ST) category as they claim to be essentially and historically a tribe.

The Kuki tribes want a separate administration or "Kukiland" carved out of Manipur, a demand towards which the Kukis have been working to achieve for decades, citing the need for a homeland for the scattered tribes who share ethnic ties with tribes in neighbouring Mizoram and Myanmar's Chin State.



A common theme in the protests today by both sides was the call to end violence that has dragged on for over a year.

In the state capital Imphal valley, hundreds of women marched in silence holding placards that asked the Union government to remove some central forces that they alleged have not done enough to check the growing menace of Kuki insurgents, who have signed

a controversial ceasefire (Suspension of Operations, or SoO, agreement).

The protesters said the Manipur issue should be discussed in parliament, and resolved as soon as possible before more lives are lost. In Kuki-dominated areas including Churachandpur and Kangpokpi districts, hundreds of people gathered to participate in marches and speeches by Kuki MLAs and civil

society leaders. They requested the Centre to create a "separate administration", or a Union Territory, by merging all Kuki-dominated areas in Manipur. There are 10 Kuki MLAs, including some from the ruling BJP, in Manipur's 60-member assembly.

The two-year-old Churachandpur-based group Indigenous Tribal Leaders Forum (ITLF) in a statement had announced it would lead a nonviolent protest to demand creation of a Union Territory for the Kukis. Other Kuki and Zo tribe groups had endorsed the ITLF's call. The ITLF said the rally highlighted the urgent need for a political solution to the Manipur ethnic crisis, which has claimed countless lives.

"If the government wants peace, then it has to come here and find peace.

BSF detains 7 Bangladeshi Nationals In Tripura

Agartala: The Border Security Force (BSF) and the Tripura Police apprehended six Bangladeshi nationals and two suspected Indian touts during a joint operation in the northeastern state on Sunday.

The BSF later said in a statement, "A joint mobile check post with sister agency was laid in... Bhatiabari Border Out Post (BOP) under Karbook police station of Gomati district on specific information today."

The joint mobile check post-party apprehended the six Bangladeshi nationals including a man and five women. The apprehended Bangladeshi nationals hail from different parts of Bangladesh like Khulna, Feni, Dhaka, Munshiganj, and Norai.

Nagaland govt to launch students' health card on Teacher's Day

Kohima: The Nagaland government will launch students' health cards on September 5 (Teacher's Day) for student's health care.

This was informed by Advisor for School Education & SCERT, Dr. Kekhrielhoulie Yhome, on Friday during the felicitation program of awardees for the Nagaland Government School Students Meritorious Award in Kohima.

He further informed that there are 1,939 government schools in Nagaland, covering every district of the state, and are equipped with well-qualified teachers for the improvement of the education system. He said the School Education department is giving its best effort to upgrade



the education system and for which, government schools have been giving free quality education.

Yhome also urged the teachers to build cordial relationships to create a congenial atmosphere in the schools.

The Advisor lamented the perception that students attending government schools are from financially weaker backgrounds,

urging people to change their mindset. Altogether 12 meritorious students from government schools who came out with flying colours were awarded at the programme.

Principal Director, Directorate of School Education, Thavaseelan K, said that the Award was started in 2023 with the aim to motivate students in government schools.

New York: India's campaign at the US Open 2024 ended on Tuesday, September 3 after Rohan Bopanna lost the mixed doubles semi-final along with his Indonesian partner Aldila Sutjiadi. Bopanna and Sutjiadi lost to the American pair of Donald Young and Taylor Townsend 3-6, 4-6 in a one-sided last-four contest.

Bopanna and Sutjiadi struggled for consistency throughout the contest. Bopanna's first service game was broken, setting the Indo-Indonesian pair on the backfoot early against the unseeded pair. Bopanna and Sutjiadi broke back, but they were not able to ride the momentum. In the second set, Bopanna's serve was broken in the

fifth game and that's all that Donald and Taylor needed. Bopanna and Sutjiadi won two third-set tie-breakers en route to the semi-final. They had beaten fourth seeds Barbora Krejcikova and Matthew Ebden, but they ran out of gas against lower-ranked Townsend and Young. Earlier in the tournament, Bopanna and Ebden crashed out in the men's doubles Round of 16. The Indo-Australian pair reached the final of the US Open last year. However, they were shown the door early after a 1-6, 5-7 defeat to 16th seeds Maximo Gonzalez and Andrés Molteni of Argentina. It was a shock defeat as the Australian Open champions were expected to challenge for the men's doubles title in New York.

Uruguay legend Luis Suarez announces retirement from international football

New Delhi: Uruquay football legend Luis Suárez has announced his retirement from international football, marking the end of an iconic career that saw him become the country's all-time top scorer. Suárez revealed his decision during a press conference on Monday, September 2, stating that he would retire after Uruguay's FIFA World Cup qualifiers against Paraguay on September 6. Suárez will conclude his international journey as Uruguay's most prolific scorer, with an impressive 69 goals in 142 appearances across 17 years. Suárez made his senior debut for Uruguay on February 8, 2007, in a 3-1 victory over Colombia. He quickly be-

came a vital part of the squad, playing a key role in securing Uruquay's spot in the 2010 FIFA World Cup in South Africa. By then, he had already cemented his place in the team, featuring in 19 of the 20 World Cup qualifying matches. "There is no better pride in oneself than knowing when the right moment to retire is, and luckily I am confident that I am retiring from the national team because I want to take a step aside...I am 37 years old, and I know that it is very difficult to get to the next World Cup. It comforts me a lot that I can retire and not for my injuries to retire me, or to stop being called up," Suarez said in the press conference

Bangladesh script history, complete 2-0 Test series sweep in Pakistan

As a result, Bangladesh won their first Test series against Pakistan after facing six losses on the trot. The final day began with Bangladesh resuming their second innings on 42/0 after seven overs with openers Zakir Hasan (31*) and Shadnam Islam (9*) at the crease. ond ball of the day against Mohammad Ali to make his intentions clear. The Bangladesh openers completed their 50-run stand in ten overs sending ominous signals in the Pakistan dressing room. India hits 20 medals at Paris Paralympics



Paris: A late medal rush on Day 6 helped India surge past its previous best-ever Paralympic medal haul of 19 on Tuesday. The country has hit the 20-medal mark for the first time at the Games (3 gold, 7 silver and 10 bronze) thanks to superlative performances by the country's track and field athletes in Paris late on Tuesday. The country ended the day at 17th place. The track and field athletes won as many as five medals (two silver and three bronze) at the Stade de France. India had won five gold, eight silver and six bronze medals at the Tokyo Paralympics.
