DMK prioritizes politics over kids' future: BJP



Chennai, Mar 4: Tamil Nadu BJP chief K Annamalai criticized the ruling DMK, claiming that the party prioritizes politics over children's future. The war of words escalated over the National Education Policy (NEP), with DMK deputy general secretary challenging Kanimozhi Annamalai to ensure the Centre released education funds if he truly cared about students.

Kanimozhi accused the BJP of manipulating data and selectively quoting statistics to fit its propaganda. She also criticized the Centre for allegedly removing foreign languages from Kendriya Vidyalayas while imposing Hindi and Sanckrit

AAP protests over BJP's Rs 2,500 monthly aid to women

New Delhi, Mar 4: The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) staged a protest demanding clarity from the BJP-led Delhi government on its promise to provide Rs 2,500 monthly financial assistance to women by International Women's Day on March 8.

The protest was led by former Chief Minister and Leader of Opposition Atishi, along with AAP MLAs and party workers. Atishi questioned the BJP government

over the delay in implementing the scheme and asked if the promise would be fulfilled or if it was just a slogan. AAP MLA Kuldeep Kumar also criticized the BJP, asking Delhi's newly appointed Chief Minister Rekha Gupta to clarify the status of the promised financial assistance. The BJP promised Rs 2,500 monthly aid to women during the Delhi Assembly elections

Nitish to contest Bihar polls with BJP, may switch sides later: Prashant Kishor

74-year-old leader too unpopular for fifth term, regardless of alliance

Patna, Mar 5: Election strategist-turned-politician Prashant Kishor on Wednesday claimed that JD(U) president Nitish Kumar will contest the upcoming assembly polls in Bihar in alliance with the BJP but may switch sides later, with hopes for another term as the chief minister.

The Jan Suraaj Party founder, who was addressing a press conference in



West Champaran district, however, also asserted that the 74-year-old leader had grown too unpopular to enjoy a fifth consecutive term in office "no matter which alliance he becomes a part of." "Anybody can become the chief minister in November, after the assembly elections are over, except Nitish Kumar. You can take it from me in writing. If I am proven wrong then I will give up my own political campaign," Kishor said.

The former JD(U) national vice president, who was expelled from the party in 2020 following a spat with Kumar.

Stalin urges newlyweds to promptly have babies amid Centre's delimitation plans

Chennai, Mar 3: Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin reportedly took a sarcastic jab at the Centre's proposed delimitation plans, suggesting that newlywed couples in the state should plan their families immediately to secure an advantage when the exercise is conducted. "I would earlier ask newlyweds to take their time before they plan a family, but not anymore," an NDTV report quoted the Chief Minister



as saying at the wedding function of a DMK district secretary in Nagapattinam. "But now, with policies such as delimitation that the Union government is planning to implement, we cannot say that. We focused on family planning and suc-

ceeded, and were pushed into a situation such as this. So I would now urge newlyweds to immediately have babies and give them good Tamil names," CM Stalin said. The ruling Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) in Tamil Nadu has been vocal in opposing the Centre's delimitation plans, which involve redrawing the boundaries of parliamentary and assembly constituencies based on demographic changes.

Modi government weakening RTI in name of data protection: Kharge

New Delhi, Mar 4: Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge on Tuesday accused the Modi government of weakening the Right To Information (RTI) Act in the name of data protection and asserted that his party will keep fighting against the "dictatorial" regime to secure the rights of the people.

Kharge asserted that the Congress will not let RTI weaken and will continue to raise its voice from the streets to Parliament. "On

one hand, India has been leading in misinformation and disinformation for years, while the Modi government is bent on weakening the RTI Act, originally implemented by the Congress-UPA, by introducing the Data Protection law," said the Congress chief in a post on X

Maharashtra govt seeks Rs 6,486 cr in Day 1 Budget session demands

Mumbai, Mar 3: The Maharashtra budget session beginning on March 3 will be a litmus test for the ruling Mahayuti government led by Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis as it will have to put on a united front amid rumblings within the coalition, even as it faces the heat from the Opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA).

With 232 MLAs, the Mahayuti coalition, comprising the BJP, the Shiv Sena, and the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP), has the numbers on its side as compared to the MVA, comprising the Congress, the Shiv Sena (UBT) and NCP (SP), which has been relegated to 47 MLAs after a drubbing in the Assembly elections last year.

However, though the Opposition has weakened, the differences that have



cropped up between Fadnavis and Deputy Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, coupled with controversies involving NCP ministers Dhananjay Munde and Manikrao Kokate, have set the stage for a noisy session.

Munde, the minister for food, civil supplies and consumer protection, has been under pressure to resign after his close aide Walmik Karad was arrested in a case linked to the mur-

der of Santosh Deshmukh, the sarpanch of Massajog in Beed district.

Meanwhile, Kokate, the agriculture minister, has been sentenced to two years in prison for his involvement in a 30-year-old document tampering and fraud case related to the acquisition of two flats under the chief minister's discretionary quota for the low-income category. Both issues are likely to be raised in the session. (PTI)

BJP-backed candidate secures victory in Telangana MLC polls

BJP's Telangana MLC win boosts party's prospects

Hyderabad, Mar 4: In the recent Telangana MLC elections, a BJP-backed candidate, Malka Komaraiah, secured a significant victory in the Medak-Nizamabad-Adilabad-Karimnagar Teachers' constituency. This win is seen as a major achievement for the BJP, as it demonstrates the trust and support of teachers in the region for the party and its leadership.

The election was held on February 27, 2025, using a preferential voting system with ballot papers. Komaraiah won the seat with a margin of over 5,000 votes against his nearest rival, Vanga Mahender Reddy. Komaraiah secured 12,959 votes, while Mahender Reddy received 7,182 votes

The counting of votes was a time-consuming process due to the segre-



gation of valid and invalid votes, followed by preferential counting.

Union Minister Bandi Sanjay Kumar hailed Komaraiah's victory as historic and stated that it shows the teachers' trust in Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership. The B.IP fielded candidates for all three MLC seats, while the ruling Congress contested only the Graduates' constituency. The Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) stayed away from the election. In addition to Komaraiah's victory, an independent candidate, Sripal Reddy Pingili also won from another constit-

UP hostels for SC/STs named after Ambedkar: CM Yogi

Lucknow, Mar 5: Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath announced that all hostels for Scheduled Castes (SCs) and Scheduled Tribes (STs) in every district of the state will be named after Dr. B.R. Ambedkar.

This decision was made to honor Ambedkar's legacy and contributions to the Indian Constitution. During the Budget discussion in the UP Vidhan Sabha, Adityanath criticized the opposition for not honoring Ambedkar and other Dalit leaders despite their claims of protecting the Constitution. Adityanath highlighted several initiatives taken by the BJPled government to honor Ambedkar, including the construction of the Ambedkar International Centre and the establishment.

Ruckus erupts in Assam assembly as BJP and opposition engage in heated war of words

Guwahti, Mar 5: The Assam assembly witnessed a ruckus on Wednesday as the ruling BJP and the opposition engaged in a war of words over the use of two controversial terms, leading to the adjournment of the House for a brief period.

Baghbor MLA Sherman Ali Ahmed, who has been suspended by the Congress, raised an issue related to the sub-divisional agricultural office of Alopati in the Barpeta district during Question Hour. While dis-



cussing the issue, he equated the "misleading replies" given by the officials to a particular word. The word was expunged by Speaker

Biswajit Daimary after BJP MLA Rupjyoti Kurmi objected to it.

After the Question Hour concluded, Kurmi again

raised the issue and asked if Ahmed had said it as he belonged to a particular community. While mentioning the community, the BJP MLA uttered a pejorative term used for Bengali-speaking Muslims in the state.

This led to a strong protest from the entire opposition with MLAs of the Congress, AIUDF, CPI(M) and Raijor Dal demanding an apology from Kurmi. The speaker immediately expunged the word.

Army sets up computer center in Imphal West

Imphal Mar 4: on Monday established a Computer Training Lab at Lerijao Upper Primary School at Khurkhul (Keingam), Imphal West District in Manipur to enhance digital literacy and promote quality education

The facility, equipped with two computers, a printer, and two UPS systems, is part of the Army's initiative to support local communities by providing modern educational tools and opportunities for youth empowerment. The train-



ing lab aims to bridge the digital divide, enabling students and youth to develop essential computer skills and improve digital literacy.

The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from local students and community members, who expressed deep gratitude toward the Indian Army for the initiative.

Security forces recover 30 kg

Bombs, averting threat in Tinsukia

Explosives cache discovered, potential threat neutralized

Tinsukia, Mar 3: In a significant operation, security forces recovered around 30 kg of explosives from the Digboi Reserve Forest in Assam's Tinsukia district. The explosives were unearthed during a joint operation by the Tinsukia police and the Indian Army. According to police sources, the explosives were buried nearly a year ago by Nabajit Asom, a recently surrendered cadre of the banned outfit ULFA-I. Officials said the explosives were concealed about 500 meters



from the Dibru River and were found hidden in eight polythene bags, a tiffin box, and a bucket. Security forces have launched a search operation in the area, suspecting the presence of more hidden stockpiles.

The operation followed the apprehension of two active members of the United

Liberation Front of Asom-Independent (ULFA-I) by Tinsukia Police on February 28. The apprehended militants, Nabajit Asom from Bolaguri in Kumthai, Golaghat, and Nitul Asom from Meleng Lohkor village in Teok were found in possession of illegal weapons. The joint operation was conducted by Assam Police, Military Intelligence, and Assam Rifles. Earlier this year, on January 25, security forces uncovered a stash of explosives in Sonitour district, Assam.

RSS chief emphasizes cultural heritage and modern aspirations in Arunachal

Itanagar. Mar 3: Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) Chief Dr. Mohan Bhagwat emphasized the importance of balancing cultural heritage with modern aspirations during his visit to the Donyi Polo Nyedar Namlo, an indigenous prayer center of the Nyishi community in Naharlagun. Dr. Bhagwat highlighted the role of spiritual practices in fostering societal harmony and nation-building. The Namlo, situated near the serene banks of the Pachin River, is dedicated to the worship of the Sun (Donyi) and the Moon (Polo),

holding deep spiritual and cultural significance for the region's indigenous people.

Dr. Mohan Bhagwat participated in the traditional prayer ceremony with humility and reverence, demonstrating deep respect for the spiritual heritage of the state's indigenous communities, according to a statement. He engaged in discussions with Namlo priests and devotees, commending their efforts to safeguard their traditions. The Donyi Polo Nyedar Namlo serves as a spiritual center for the Nyishi people.

20 illegal weapons voluntarily

surrendered



Imphal, Mar 3: Following an appeal by Manipur Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla and public awareness campaigns by District Police, Assam Rifles, and CRPF, civilians and community groups in Manipur have begun surrendering illegally held weapons. On Sunday, 20 illegal weapons were voluntarily surrendered by the public in Imphal East, Bishnupur, Jiribam, and Imphal West districts.

In a separate operation, Manipur Police arrested two individuals for possessing 20 soap cases suspected to contain brown sugar weighing 828 grams. The arrest occurred near Upper Kathikho Karong at the KSTC waste dumping area in Senapati district. A four-wheeler used for transportation was also seized, according to an official statement.

Additionally, two active cadres of KCP (PWG) were arrested from the hilltop of Ngariyan Hill under Irilbung police station in Imphal East district. The duo allegedly involved in arms transportation and extortion.

Mizoram Minister to introduce bill on placement agencies

Aizawl, Mar 3: Mizoram Labour, Employment, Skill Development, and Entrepreneurship (LESDE) Minister Lalnghinglova Hmar is set to introduce a bill to regulate private agencies involved in recruiting and sending youths for placement jobs abroad. Hmar will present the Mizoram Private Placement Agencies (Regulation) Bill, 2025, in the state assembly on Monday.

This bill aims to reg-

ulate private placement agencies' operations, ensuring they legally send youths for jobs, including domestic work, both within India and abroad. If enacted, the bill will require private placement agencies to register with the government and obtain a license to operate. The necessity for this bill arose after some Mizo women,



illegally sent by private placement agencies to foreign countries, particularly Syria, UAE, and other Gulf nations for domestic work, encountered legal issues last year. The Mizoram government, along with generous individuals and the Centre, successfully rescued several Mizo women from Syria and other Arab countries.

The Mizoram Private Placement Agencies (Regulation) Act was enacted in 2015 under the Lal Thanhawla-led Congress government. However, the earlier law allowed agencies to place women as domestic workers nationwide.

Kohima windstorm ignites wildfires, causing widespread damage in Nagaland

Kohima, Mar 3: Strong winds on Sunday fueled fire incidents multiple across seven locations in and around Kohima, including Meriema, Chakhabama, Seikhazou D. Khel Kohima Village, the Medical College area, D. Block, and two sites in Lower Forest Colony. Chumbemo Patton, SI (O.C) of the North Kohima Fire Station, reported that nearly all the incidents were jungle fires, and no casualties have been reported. Authorities have controlled most of the fires, though the exact cause remains unknown.

In another incident, strong winds caused a tree to fall near the Nagaland Olympic Office (NOA) in Kohima, damaging at least three parked vehicles. The Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority



(NSDMA) reported significant damages across the state due to an unprecedented windstorm. Commissioner and Secretary Lhouchalie Viya stated that strong winds affected Kohima, Kiphire, and Noklak districts.In Kohima, fallen trees damaged parked vehicles at Raj Bhavan Colony and several VIP quarters. wildfire Additionally, а broke out at Forest Colony, prompting an immediate response from the State

Disaster Response Force and other agencies to protect residents and property. Kiphire and Noklak districts also sustained damages. Report indicated household destruction in Seyochung and Kiusam circles of Kiphire and Nokyan B Village in Noklak. NSDMA stated that it is assessing the full extent of the damages and awaits further reports from the District Disaster Management Authorities.



Smith, who top-scored for Australia with 73, immediately informed his teammates that he'd played his last one-day international. The 35-year-old, however, will continue playing Tests and T20Is for his country.

Atletico hoping Alvarez can end Real Madrid heartbreak in Europe

Alvarez scores 9 goals in 13 matches, totaling 21 in 40 games

Madrid. Mar 3: For Atletico Madrid it has been a repetitious and painful tale whenever they have faced city rivals Real Madrid in Europe, but they signed Julian Alvarez to try and rip up the script.

The Argentina international has become Atletico's key attacking threat after arriving from Manchester City last summer and will lead the line for them on Tuesday at the Santiago Bernabeu in the Champions League last 16.

Atletico have reached three Champions League finals and lost every time, including against Real Madrid in 2014 and 2016.

Those agonising defeats, the first in extra-time and the second on penalties, were compounded by Los



Blancos wins in the 2015 quarter-finals and 2017 semi-finals. The only other occasion they have met in the competition was in 1959, when after an aggregate semi-final draw the tie went to a play-off. Real Madrid emerged triumphant and went on to lift a fourth consecutive European Cup. Their dominance in the competition has held until this day, with Carlo Ancelotti's side record 15-time winners and the current holders.

Diego Simeone's team were ousted by Borussia Dortmund in last year's quarter-finals, one of the low points of a miserable campaign. They responded in the summer by signing Alvarez for 85 million euros (\$88 million).

South Africa hope to end title jinx

Lahore, Mar 4: South Africa has a long history of near-misses in ICC tournaments, often reaching the semifinals or finals but failing to secure the title. The only ICC trophy they have won is the 1998 Champions Trophy. As they prepare to face New Zealand in the semifinals of the 2025 ICC Champions Trophy, they hope to break this "title jinx" and win their first ICC silverware since 1998. South Africa has consistently performed well in ICC tournaments, reaching the semifinals or finals on 13 occasions across both limited-overs formats. However, they have often fallen short at the crucial moments. This time, they are determined to change their fortunes.
